

The core mission of the Office of the Director of National Intelligence (ODNI) is to lead the U.S. Intelligence Community (IC). FOUNDATIONS FOR THE FUTURE A Strategy for the IC

Every four years, ODNI is required to publish a new National Intelligence Strategy (NIS) that considers and provides the IC's future course and intelligence support to policymakers. Historically, the NIS has been written by IC subject matter experts in a classified environment. For the first time, ODNI and NIU are inviting academics and national security thought leaders to contribute to the IC's understanding of the current threat landscape and future intelligence challenges.

NIU and ODNI are hosting a series of events throughout 2025 called *Foundations for the Future: A Strategy for the IC* that will culminate in a one-day event on September 24, 2025. This initiative will be made up of a series of hybrid events and forums (i.e., virtual and in-person) for academics, thought leaders, and national security professionals to discuss grand strategy, enterprise strategies, and their applications to the IC. Proceedings from these events may inform the next NIS.

Multidisciplinary scholars and thought leaders are invited to submit a paper relating to one or more of the following featured themes:

- Shaping strategy for shifting national security challenges in an increasingly complex environment.
- > Anticipating how the future security environment could impact the IC's strategic capabilities.
- Collaborating across industry to identify critical and emerging technologies and their potential impact on the IC's strategic outlook.
- > Establishing effective goals to shape the future of intelligence.

Paper proposals should be original research and intended for publication. Please submit your proposal package to <u>NIU Future Foundations@niu.odni.gov</u>, before **May 30, 2025**. Complete proposal packages include the following information.

- You recognize and understand that Foundations for the Future: A Strategy for the IC is not a political forum. Proposals submitted with deliberate and/or overt intent to advance political messaging will not be accepted.
- > You are sharing your research freely, without coercion, or compensation.
- You understand that if your proposal is accepted, my research, ideas, and viewpoints will not necessarily be included in the next National Intelligence Strategy.
